## President's Corner

Our Sapphire Lakes community has been very busy this season with all of our activities running at full throttle. The Activities Team hit a home run with their annual Chili Fiesta on Saturday February 17<sup>th</sup> and is planning another great picnic for Saturday March 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Blue Zone group ran a number of successful events and activities in February and has plans for several more in March including the always popular "Wine at 5" on March 28<sup>th</sup>. I hope that our residents explore this newsletter and take advantage of as many of the wide variety of our offerings as they are able.

We are extremely happy with the resurfacing of the tennis & pickleball courts that resulted in us having two beautiful, dedicated tennis courts and six beautiful, dedicated pickleball courts with three colors. It seems that there are more players than ever taking advantage of these facilities.

At the February 21<sup>st</sup> Master Board meeting our current Bulk Services Comcast contract was renewed two years early and will run from May 1, 2024 to June 1, 2033. With the expert assistance of Patrick Ryan, our consultant from Converged Services Inc., we were able to lower our costs and increase the quality of our services with Comcast and their terrific X-1 technology. Listed below are the major highlights of the new agreement which go into effect on May 1<sup>st</sup>:

- Currently we pay \$83.82 per month for Internet and TV, and beginning May 1st we will be lowering that by 6% to \$78.50 per month which will save our current budget \$3,318 per month beginning May 1st,
- Comcast agreed to lower our annual increase from 4% down to 3.5% which is a savings of about \$4,000 per year.
- > Comcast will give us a **\$200 signing bonus** for each of our 590 doors for a total of **\$118,000**.
- Equipment Upgrades: with the X-1 system we currently get a modem (router), two X-1 boxes that are capable of recording and also can receive premium channels. You also are entitled to a third box which will receive just regular programming. With the new contract, beginning May 1<sup>st</sup>, you will be able to swap out that regular box for a X-1 box by simply going to the Comcast store and turning in that third box.
- In 2025 Comcast is going to upgrade the wiring in each of our 590 units which will enable us to have "symmetrical speed". Currently our download speed is 400 mbs but our upload speed is just 10 mbs. Once our wiring is upgraded in 2025 our speeds will be increased to 500/500 mbs both up and down. They anticipate that it won't be long before those speeds will be 1 gig/1 gig up and down.
- Another advantage of renewing the contract now is that in year 4 or 5 of the new contract we will be able to start this process again and negotiate lower prices and another "door bonus".

## Treasurer's Report

Financially Sapphire Lakes is in good shape. That being said, 2023 has been a tough year from a budget standpoint. The final numbers are now in, we ended the year \$47,629 over budget. Inflation and irrigation issues were part of the problem but we also had to make some adjustment for invoices charged to the wrong year. The one bright area was interest from CD's & Money market accounts, we were able to earn over \$11,083 in 2023. Listed below are the main areas where we were over budget;

- 1. Trash Removal \$4,000
- 2. Water \$5,300
- 3. Irrigation \$30,000
- 4. Building Maintenance \$6,000
- 5. Gates \$3,000
- 6. Landscaping \$15,000

The \$47,629 we are over budget will come out of our Contingency/Emergency account so we will end the year in that account with around \$52,000 in funds. We ended the year with an operating equity of \$105,851. With the signing of a new contact with Comcast this year that figure will increase close to \$150,000 between the signing bonus of \$118,000 plus savings from the reduced cost in cable and Internet of \$25,000 in our budget. For 2024 the Master budget will increase by 7%. That includes an increase of 9% in operating expense, 4% in cable fees and 4% in internet fees, 15% in reserve contribution. All basically due to high inflation. Contribution to reserve dollars went up by \$13,000 to \$102,000 from \$89,000. Again, this is due to inflation. As far as interest on our reserves, we expect to be getting over 5% on CD'S and 4% on money market reserves. In 2023 we spent around \$58,947 out of our reserve account on the following items:

- 1. Fountain Repairs \$3,600
- 2. Irrigation Pumps \$11,300
- 3. Asaf street \$18,600
- 4. Tennis Court \$15,750
- 5. Pool pump \$4,940
- 6. Sidewalk \$1,602

For 2024 the plan is to spend around \$38,190 in the following reserve items:

- 1. Tennis/Pickle ball court \$14,575
- 2. Pumps/Fountains \$15,200
- 3. Resurface pool decks \$7,000

These are the final numbers I will go into more detail at the annual meeting in March. I want you all to know that your board is working very hard to control expenses. It is really tough times right now with the age of our community and the way inflation is hitting us.

#### Pool Telephones

The landline telephones have been removed from all four pools and replaced with 911 Emergency Cell Phones.

#### Rental of Cabanas

Any resident wishing to use any of the cabanas for personal gatherings must apply fourteen (14) days in advance. Applications can be obtained from Suzanne Foster, Property Manager. This applies only to cabanas. Pools and pool decks are always open to all residents and may not be reserved or rented. A deposit of \$50 is required which will be refunded if the area is cleaned up property. **Social distancing and hygiene plans will be reviewed with applicant before approval.** Further details are available in the application.

#### Attention Walkers, Bikers and Drivers

**Walkers**: please make sure that you walk AGAINST the traffic when walking the streets at Sapphire Lakes and wear light colors and/or reflective clothing when walking in non-daylight hours. **Bikers**: please make sure to ride WITH the traffic and to have reflectors and/or lights on your bicycle. Helmets are recommended. We want everyone to be safe!!

And vehicles, please obey the Stop signs including those at the driveways. Please be aware of those on the street walking or biking in these areas. We have been fortunate that no one has caused an accident yet but the potential is there. Please do this for the safety of all!

#### Entrance Gates

Unit owners may purchase additional gate access cards and vehicle bar codes at a **cost of \$25.00** by check or money order only and are available from our Property Manager, Suzanne Foster. Credit cards are now accepted but there is a \$1.06 service charge. NO CASH.

#### Pool Umbrellas

All pools have umbrellas on the decks. If you are the last to leave the pool area, please be responsible and lower any umbrellas that are open. Thank you.

#### **Defibrillators**

An Automated Electronic Defibrillator (AED) is installed at the cabana at the Recreation area restroom and all four pools. Before using the AED machine, assure that **911** has been called. Turn on the AED and follow the audio prompts.

## Central Car Washing Area

There is an area located near the recreation area washroom facility for residents to wash cars. It is **mandatory** for boats to be washed only in this area. Boat rinsing should be limited to 15 minutes after it has been in saltwater.

## Comcast Issues

Any Comcast related issues should be addressed with Comcast by calling 1-800-XFINITY stating you are part of the Bulk Services Contract at Sapphire Lakes. It is also important to note that every Sapphire Lakes unit has a Comcast account. If you sell your unit, please be sure your name is removed from the account to ensure that you are not billed in the future. It would also be prudent to turn in your equipment to Comcast allowing the new owner to set up their own account with Comcast.

## Your Pets

Please report any violations of the pet rules that you witness or observe to our Property Manager, Suzanne Foster (353-2465) so that proper action can be taken against offenders.

**<u>Reminder!!!</u>** And also –Please do not feed the wild animals including feral cats, squirrels and ducks! They are creatures of the wild and should fend for themselves. After Association meetings at the Pools or gatherings at the Picnic area, any garbage should be removed and placed in a dumpster nearby.

## <u>Garden Waste</u>

Plant debris should be piled or bagged and placed along the street, not at the dumpsters or parking lots, for pick up by the landscaping company on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

## **Recycling and Trash**

Residents are urged to please help the environment by recycling whenever possible. Newspaper, flyers, flattened small cardboard boxes, catalogs, magazines, telephone books, paper grocery bags, clear, green and brown bottles and jars, aluminum and steel/tin food and beverage cans, all plastics #1 through #7 can all be places in the recycle bins.

### Please, please, do not put <u>plastic bags</u> or <u>garbage</u> into the re-cycling bins!!!!

Before placing large cardboard boxes in the garbage bins, please **break them down** to ensure that the dumpsters are not filled before the garbage truck arrives. Small boxes should be collapsed and placed in the recycling containers.

For those units that have individual trash and recycling tote bins, please call **Collier County at 239-252-2380** for disposal of larger items such as TV's, mattresses, furniture, etc. For those using large dumpsters please contact **Roberto at 239-316-6452.** There is a charge for special pickup.

For hazardous wastes such as paint, oil or solvents, they may be taken to the Waste Disposal site at 2640 Corporate Flight Drive with no fee. They are open Tuesday to Saturday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

# SWIMMING POOL RULES

## **NO SMOKING**

ON THE POOL DECK OR IN THE CABANA, CAPACITY OF THIS POOL IS <u>23</u> PERSONS

Children 12 years of age and younger must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or other responsible person 16 years of age or older.

- Swimming is only permitted between dawn and dusk.
- All persons using any pool must be appropriately attired.
- All persons must shower before entering the pool.
- Pool safety equipment and cables should be kept in place and are not to be used except for their intended purpose.
- No inflatable devices over 2 feet in diameter are allowed. Noodles and swimming aids are allowed.
- No glass or animals in the fenced pool area (5 feet / 15.2 meters from unfenced pool.)
- Running, jumping, skating, bicycling or throwing any kind of item or any other activity that creates a danger or annoyance in the general pool area is prohibited.
- No food or beverage in the pool or on the wet deck. Commercially bottled water in plastic bottles is allowed on pool wet deck for pool patron hydration.
- Incontinent persons and infants not yet potty trained must wear pants specifically designed for use in the water, such as "little swimmers" while in any pool.
- Only radios with headphones may be used at the pool.

## **NO DIVING**

Do not swallow the pool water

Pool MAXIMUM depth: 6 FT
