President's Corner

Well the month of January is behind us, and although the weather wasn't as warm as we usually expect it to be, we did have a great start to the 2025 social season at Sapphire Lakes. Congratulations to the Activities Team for hosting a terrific Picnic on January 18th which was attended by 150+ people. It turned out to be one of the best weather days of the month. We have many new owners and renters here this season and we met many of them at the picnic. There are a number of social events scheduled for the month of February that you will read about in this newsletter and I encourage all of you to participate in as many of them as you can.

Our full slate of community activities is now under way as we move into the month of February. Many of them are described in this newsletter and all of them are detailed on our website www.sapphirelakesnaples.net as well.

Our new landscaping and irrigation company, Daley Lawn Care, has gotten off to a great start and are working diligently all around the property. One request that they have about residents putting out landscape debris along the roadway: please don't put the debris in plastic bags. Small cardboard boxes can be used to put out clippings or dead flowers, etc. and the box will be left behind. They will pick up such debris in the area of the community where they are working each day.

We ask that everyone be aware, especially after dark, that we continue to have wildlife within our property. Two coyotes have been seen recently and the Florida Wildlife Dept. has informed us that this is mating season for the coyotes and the males in particular are moving around actively. There is still evidence of bears on the property and they will continue to remain as long as they find food sources. We ask everyone to close the

dumpster fence gates after disposing of your trash, and please be particularly aware of your surroundings after dark, especially when walking pets.

The next Master Board meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, February 19th at 10:00 am at the Pool 3 Cabana. All owners are welcome to attend.

Treasurer's Report

While the final numbers are not in yet, it looks like we will be under budget in 2024 by around \$29,000. Again, this is only because of the newly signed contact with Comcast that Bob Foster negotiated. This new contact reduced our cost of Video & Internet in the second half of 2024 by 8%, saving us \$31,900. Without that we would have been around \$3,000 over budget.

Listed below are the areas where we were way over budget:

- 1. Trash Removal \$5,446
- 2. Irrigation Repairs \$10,000
- 3. Tree Maintenance \$8,000
- 4. Pool Repairs \$8,000

The good news is that most of these expenses were offset in other accounts by the hard work of our Property Manager Suzanne Foster.

As part of the new 10-year Comcast contract we also received a signing bonus of \$118,000. In order to avoid paying taxes on this money, we will only be booking one tenth of it each year. In the meantime, the rest of the money is sitting in a CD paying 5.16% this year. This means we will also have an additional income of \$13,100 in 2024 from this Comcast bonus money. We will also have an additional \$3,600 in operating interest thanks to making better use of our cash on hand through money market accounts paying over 4% rather than checking account paying less than 1%. All of the savings from this year's budget will go in our Contingency Account taking that back up to around \$100,000 to start 2025. I just want to remind everyone this money is sitting in a special account to be used as an emergency should we get hit by another hurricane or if some other unforeseen expense comes up.

For 2025 the Master budget increased by 2.30%. Operational Maintenance fees went up 7.25% but due to the decreases of 5.6% in Internet & Cable fees, the total fees only went up 2.4% in 2025. Thank you, Bob Foster. We have good news in the Operating budget to start 2025. Our insurance which is billed in January came in way lower than expected. Our insurance agent gave us an estimate of \$52,000 but the actual number came in at \$35,931 which means we will start the new year with an extra \$16,000.

The 2025 contribution to Reserve dollars went up from \$102,000 to \$112,000. Again, this is due to inflation. The cost of many of the reserves items have been coming in higher than projected. As far as interest on our reserves, we earned \$19,310 in interest for 2024. We expect to be getting over 4.5% on CD'S and 4% on money market accounts in 2025. In 2024 we spent around \$39,000 out of our Reserve Account on the following items:

- 1. Fountain Repairs \$1,720
- 2. Irrigation Pumps \$10,899
- 3. Tennis/ Pickleball courts \$16,300
- 4. Pool resurfacing \$10,080

For 2025 the plan is to spend around \$74,000 in the following reserve items:

- 1. Sealing Black top streets \$55,000
- 2. Irrigation Pumps \$14,000
- 3. Resurface pool decks \$5,000

All of these numbers are year end estimates but very close to the final numbers. We will give you the final numbers in the next newsletter and at the annual meeting in March. I want you all to know that your board is working very hard to control expenses. It is really tuff times right now with the age of our community and the way inflation is hitting us.

If someone falls and needs assistance getting up, but not to go to the hospital, one can call **239-252-9300** for assistance.

Pool Telephones

We no longer have landline telephones at our four pools and instead we have replaced them with 911 Emergency Cell Phones.

Rental of Cabanas

Any resident wishing to use any of the cabanas for personal gatherings must apply fourteen (14) days in advance. Applications can be obtained from Suzanne Foster, Property Manager. This applies only to cabanas. Pools and pool decks are always open to all residents and may not be reserved or rented. A deposit of \$50 is required which will be refunded if the area is cleaned up property. **Social distancing and hygiene plans will be reviewed with applicant before approval.** Further details are available in the application.

Attention Walkers, Bikers and Drivers

Walkers: please make sure that you walk AGAINST the traffic when walking the streets at Sapphire Lakes and wear light colors and/or reflective clothing when walking in non-daylight hours. **Bikers**: please make sure to ride WITH the traffic and to have reflectors and/or lights on your bicycle. Helmets are recommended. We want everyone to be safe!! **And vehicles**, please obey the Stop signs **including those at the driveways**. **Please be aware of the people that are on the street walking or biking in these areas**. We have been fortunate that no one has caused an accident yet but the potential is always there. Please do this for the safety of all!

Entrance Gates

Unit owners may purchase additional gate access cards and vehicle bar codes at a **cost of \$25.00** by check or money order only and are available from our Property Manager, Suzanne Foster. Credit cards are now accepted but there is a \$1.06 service charge. NO CASH.

Pool Umbrellas

All pools have umbrellas on the decks. If you are the last to leave the pool area, please be responsible and lower any umbrellas that are open. Thank you.

Defibrillators

An Automated Electronic Defibrillator (AED) is installed at the cabana at the Recreation area restroom and all four pools.

Before using the AED machine, assure that 911 has been called. Turn on the AED and follow the audio prompts.

Central Car Washing Area

There is an area located near the recreation area washroom facility for residents to wash cars. It is **mandatory** for boats to be washed only in this area. Boat rinsing should be limited to 15 minutes after it has been in saltwater.

Comcast Issues

Any Comcast related issues should be addressed with Comcast by calling 1-800-XFINITY stating you are part of the Bulk Services Contract at Sapphire Lakes. It is also important to note that every Sapphire Lakes unit has a Comcast account. If you sell your unit, please be sure your name is removed from the account to ensure that you are not billed in the future. It would also be prudent to turn in your equipment to Comcast allowing the new owner to set up their own account with Comcast.

Your Pets

Please report any violations of the pet rules that you witness or observe to our Property Manager, Suzanne Foster (353-2465) so that proper action can be taken against offenders.

<u>Reminder!!!</u> Please do not feed the wild animals including feral cats, squirrels and ducks! They are creatures of the wild and should fend for themselves. After Association meetings at the Pools or gatherings at the Picnic area, any garbage should be removed and placed in a dumpster nearby.

Garden Waste

Plant debris should be piled or bagged and placed along the street, not at the dumpsters or parking lots, for pick up by the landscaping company on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Recycling and Trash

Residents are urged to please help the environment by recycling whenever possible. Newspaper, flyers, flattened small cardboard boxes, catalogs, magazines, telephone books, paper grocery bags, clear, green and brown bottles and jars, aluminum and steel/tin food and beverage cans, all plastics #1 through #7 can all be placed in the recycle bins.

Please, please, do not put plastic bags or garbage into the re-cycling bins!!!!

Before placing large cardboard boxes in the garbage bins, please **break them down** to ensure that the dumpsters are not filled before the garbage truck arrives. Small boxes should be collapsed and placed in the recycling containers.

For those units that have individual trash and recycling to bins, please call **Collier County at 239-252-2380** for disposal of larger items such as TV's, mattresses, furniture, etc. For those using large dumpsters please contact **Roberto at 239-316-6452.** There is a charge for special pickup.

PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE ARTICLES BESIDE THE DUMPSTERS!!

For hazardous wastes such as paint, oil or solvents, they may be taken to the Waste Disposal site at 2640 Corporate Flight Drive with no fee. They are open Tuesday to Saturday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

SWIMMING POOL RULES

NO SMOKING

ON THE POOL DECK OR IN THE CABANA, CAPACITY OF THIS POOL IS 23 PERSONS

Children 12 years of age and younger must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or other responsible person 16 years of age or older.

- Swimming is only permitted between dawn and dusk.
- All persons using any pool must be appropriately attired.
- All persons must shower before entering the pool.
- Pool safety equipment and cables should be kept in place and are not to be used except for their intended purpose.
- No inflatable devices over 2 feet in diameter are allowed. Noodles and swimming aids are allowed.
- No glass or animals in the fenced pool area (5 feet / 15.2 meters from unfenced pool.)
- Running, jumping, skating, bicycling or throwing any kind of item or any other activity that creates a danger or annoyance in the general pool area is prohibited.
- No food or beverage in the pool or on the wet deck. Commercially bottled water in plastic bottles is allowed on pool wet deck for pool patron hydration.
- Incontinent persons and infants not yet potty trained must wear pants specifically designed for use in the water, such as "little swimmers" while in any pool.
- Only radios with headphones may be used at the pool.

NO DIVING

Do not swallow the pool water

Pool MAXIMUM depth: 6 FT
